Sharing Your Faith

THE POWER OF PRAYER

"I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; ²¹ that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me. ²² And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one: ²³ I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me."

Christianity is a taught religion. No one comes to Christ by accident. Jesus said, "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up at the last day. It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Therefore everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to Me" (John 6:44-45). Only those who learn of Christ can come to Christ! It is only through the gospel that the Father exercises His power to draw lost souls unto Himself. Paul affirmed that all are called to God through the gospel which he preached (2 Thess. 2:14). Indeed, the gospel is "the power of God unto salvation..." (Rom. 1:16).


Keep in mind that Jesus often taught one on one. Nicodemus and the Samaritan woman are two classic examples of the Lord's personal teaching (John 3,4). Philip, while highly successful in public preaching in Samaria, was sent by the Holy Spirit to teach a man of Ethiopia in a private study (Acts 8:26-40). Paul and Silas had a personal Bible study with the Jailor at Philippi (Acts 16:23-33). These examples should impress us with the importance of "one on one" evangelism.

•In order to be an effective soul-winner, one must have a passion for the lost. Jesus taught that one soul is of greater value than the whole world (Matthew 16:26; Mark 8:37). Most failures in life can be traced to a wrong attitude. On the other hand, one can succeed at almost anything if the right attitude is present. In trying to reach the lost, remember that the one we are trying to reach is a precious soul...an individual with all the feelings, propensities, and prejudices of other human beings. As Jesus sent out the twelve apostles on the limited commission, he said, "Behold, I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves; be ye therefore wise as serpents, and harmless as doves" (Matthew 10:16).

•May we therefore assume that the one we are attempting to lead to Christ is honest and sincere. He may have already formed some beliefs, whether right or wrong, which he holds dear. He has as much right to try to persuade you to change as you do to persuade him. However, let us keep in mind that we are not representing some mundane product such as detergent or corn flakes. We are not trying to get people to exchange one brand of religion for another. We are simply teaching what the Bible teaches. May we do this without giving the impression that we think others are stupid or insincere. Only by gaining their friendship and regard can we ever hope to gain a listening ear.




Christian Attitudes in Personal Evangelism



•Don'ts


1. Don't have a "holier than thou" attitude (Luke 18:9).
2. Don't be ashamed of the gospel – Paul wasn't (Romans 1:16).
3. Don't begin with criticism – find common ground on which to build.
4. Don't get angry (Ecclesiastes 7:9).
5. Don't go too fast.
6. Don't do all the talking. Ask a question – get some feedback.
7. Don't answer every question. Wait until an appropriate time.
8. Don't wear out your welcome.
9. Don't belittle the church, or members of the congregation.
10. Don't correct every mistake in the misuse of Bible terms such as "pastor" or "reverend." There will be time for this later if you keep the door open.
11. Don't give up!
12. Above all, don't be afraid to try. Remember: the Lord said, "I am with you always..." (Matthew 28:20).



Some "Do's" and "Don'ts" of Personal Evangelism



1. Do remember to pray for those you are teaching (Romans 10:1)
2. Do study thoroughly what you intend to teach.
3. Do work closely with other Christians.
4. Do be optimistic and friendly.
5. Do show interest in others.
6. Do strive to lead rather than drive.
7. Do be courteous and polite.
8. Do be considerate of the other person's time.
9. Do leave the door open for further study.
10. Do keep "planting" and "watering" and depend on God for the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6).




Security Checklist

ROLE PLAY



Preparation for role play

- Pray and be prepared to share the gospel with every encounter (John 4:7)
- Keep your eyes open for divine appointments to happen because of the message that people see on your shirt. You can be like Esther who was in the right place at the right time as queen and as Esther 4:14 says, “Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?”
- Be bold and don’t let fear hold you back from sharing the love of Christ. Acts 14:3 – So Paul and Barnabas spent considerable time there, speaking boldly for the Lord.
- Be ready to speak about how God has blessed you abundantly so that someone might know that you are blessed!
- Psalm 119:11 – I have hidden your word in my heart.
- Look for opportunities to bless someone through your words AND deeds. James 1:22 – But don’t just listen to God’s word. You must do what it says. Otherwise, you are only fooling yourselves.
- Don’t force your testimony on people! Ask them “may I share my testimony with you?” This gives them a vested interest in what you have to say.
- Put together your personal testimony in a way that you can easily and quickly share it with others. Start by asking yourself these questions. What has Jesus saved me from? What has Jesus done in my life? How has his love changed me? What does my relationship with Him look like? Now write your answers down. Read over or even memorizing your answers. At some point someone else will ask you one of those questions, and you will know exactly what to say!

Interactive Role Plays

- Be yourself. Don't try to use churchy words or speak 'Christianese'. Have a conversation with others; don't 'preach at them'. Tell them what your life was like before you became a Christian and how Jesus has made a difference in your life.
- Be respectful and show courtesy – Love is shown by our respect for others. Jesus died for all, with no exceptions, and we must show that kindness and compassion to others.

Role Play

- Now, we will place each person in a group to do some real life evangelistic outreach. Please select a group and gather in your own circle to discuss the steps your group will take to share Jesus in the following scenarios.
- **Scenario/Group 1**
- Lisa is a homeless mom of 4 and you meet her while doing outreach in the park. She has no food or clothing yet wants money to buy "food." She's from Atlanta and has no relatives here. Her children are in foster care. She lives in the park and sometimes has to do "other" things to make ends meet.
- **Scenario/Group 2**
- John is a former banker who has fallen on hard times. He's very educated but has never been to church before. He has a wife and children but is on the fence about "organized" religion.
- **Scenario/Group 3**
- Lil John has just been released from Juvenile Hall. He has tattoos all over his face and a spike through his nose. His grandmother raised him in the church and today he's hanging out at the liquor store. He asks you to tell him more about Jesus.
